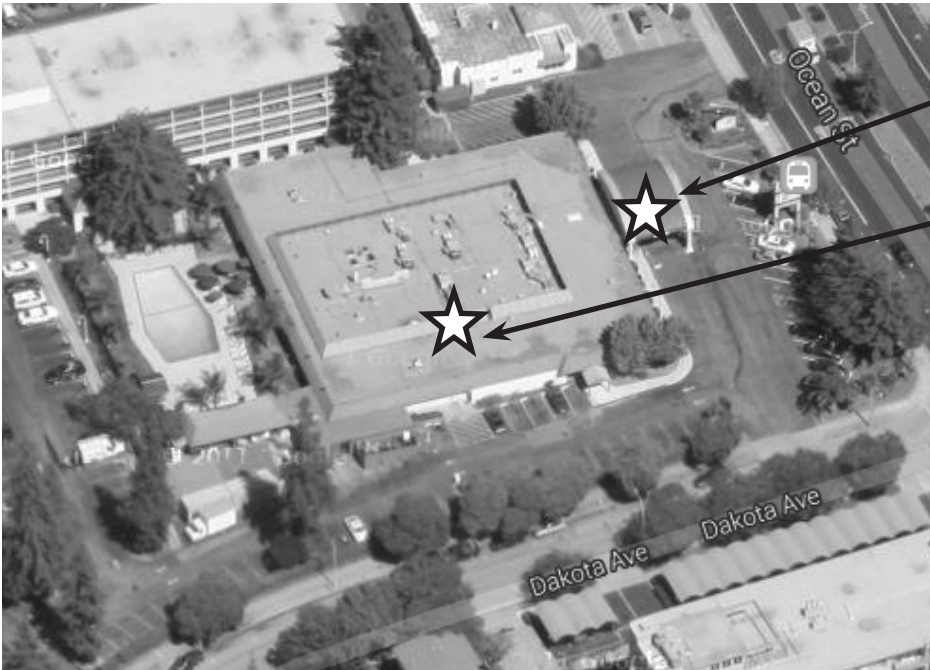

### Directions: CA-1 North to UC Santa Cruz

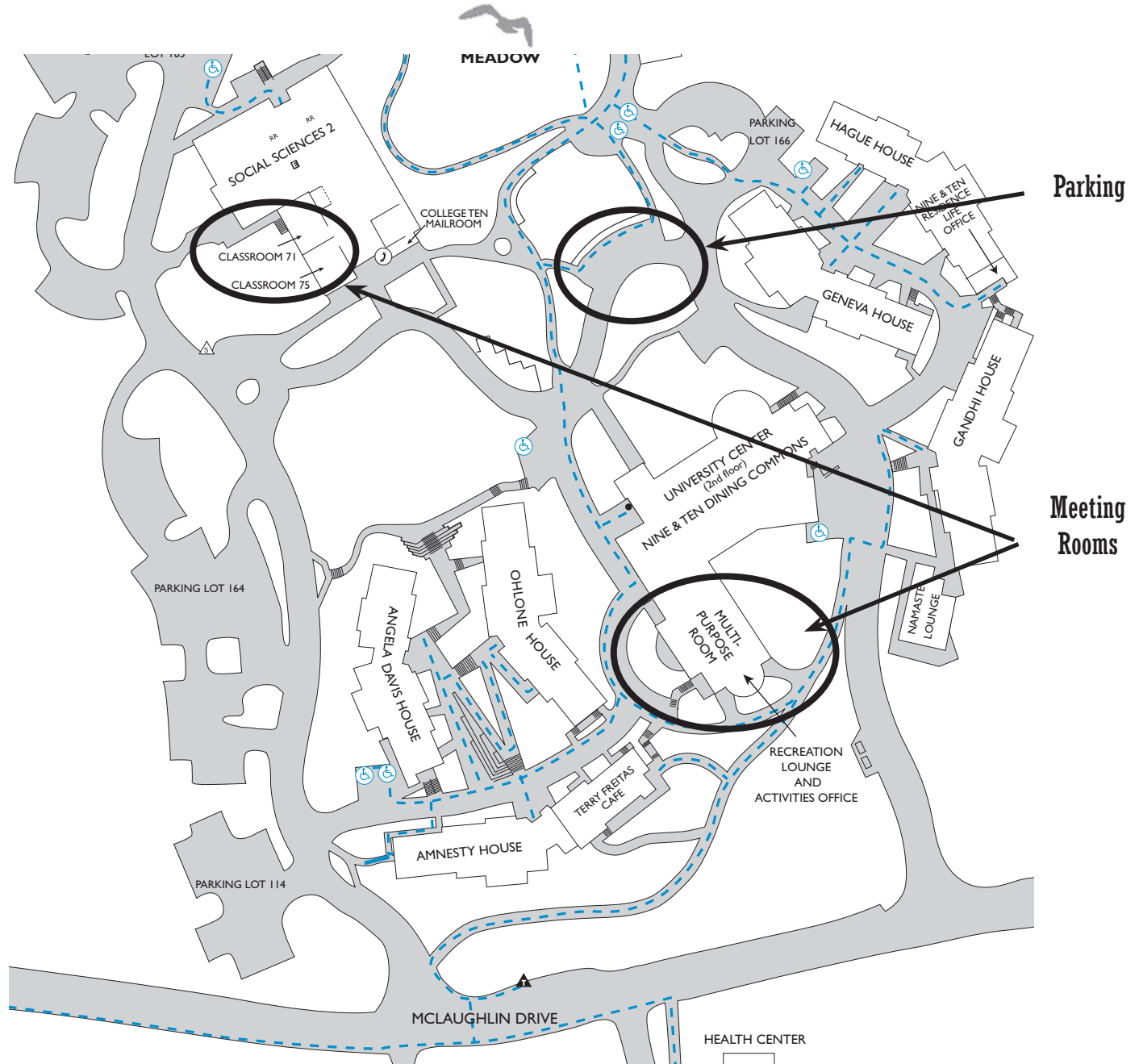
1. Coming from the south (heading north on the CA-1), keep left at fork and follow signs for California 1/Santa Cruz/Half Moon Bay

4. Turn left onto High Street
5. Turn right onto Glenn Coolidge Drive which will continue onto McLaughlin Drive
6. Turn right onto College Nine Road
7. Continue into Parking Lot 166

1. Coming from the north (heading south on the CA-17), keep right to continue onto CA-1 N
2. Turn right onto Highland Avenue

5. Turn right onto College Nine Road
6. Continue into Parking Lot 166



# PARKING ON CAMPUS



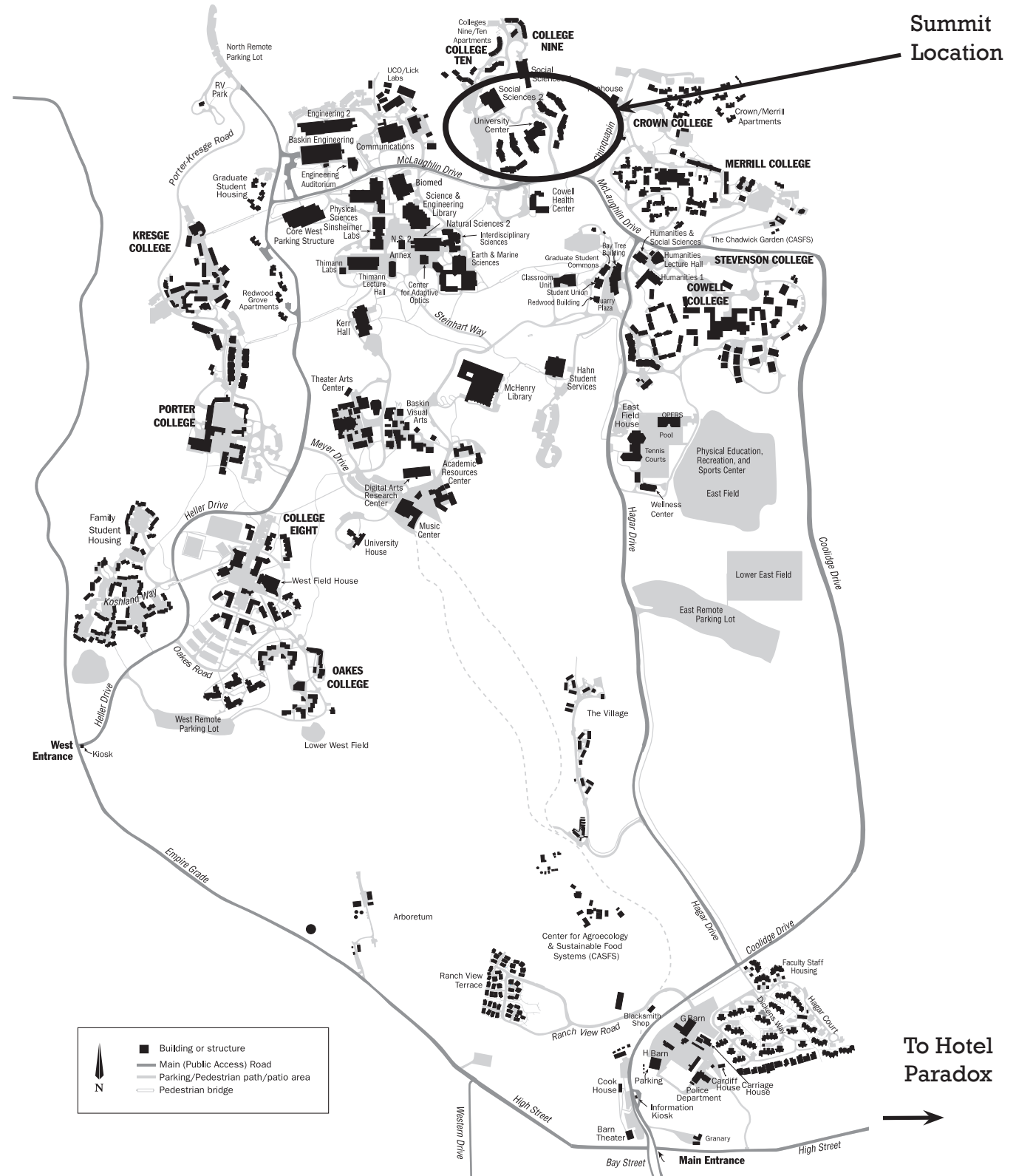
