Building Envelope Technologies Subcommittee Charter  
January 2015

The Alliance to Save Energy chartered a Policy and Programs Committee in 2005 to provide advice and counsel to the Board of Directors on creation and execution of policy platforms, advocacy campaigns, and new programs. The Committee is chaired by two sitting members of the Alliance's Board of Directors and membership is open to representatives of companies and organizations who are Associate members of the Alliance in good standing. In addition, the Committee co-chairs, Board and/or senior management may invite individuals to participate at technical advisors as deemed appropriate.

There are several key issue areas of interest to Alliance Board and Associate members that warrant a specific focus. These include finance, building envelope, and the nexus between water and energy. The Alliance is chartering and forming three subcommittees of the Policy and Programs Committee to develop and agenda and execute policies and programs in these three core areas. Each subcommittee will be chaired by one or more representatives of Associate member organizations. Membership on the subcommittees will be open to representatives of all Alliance Associate member companies and as with the Policy Committee, specific, non-Associate member individuals may be appointed to provide technical assistance to one or more of the subcommittees.

**Building Envelope Technologies Subcommittee**

**Purpose:** The purpose of the Building Envelope Technologies Subcommittee is to develop and recommend an Alliance legislative and regulatory agenda that will advance the development and deployment of efficiency building envelope technologies.

Roles and Responsibilities:

- Recommend overarching goals for energy efficiency in the buildings sector.
- Recommend Alliance positions and/or advocacy campaigns on legislation and regulations related to buildings that can advance use of efficient building envelope technologies.
- Develop recommendations for new legislation and/or regulations to advance efficient building envelope technologies.

**Membership:** The subcommittee will be chaired by a Board or Associate member representative of the building envelope sector. Membership is open to representatives of Alliance Associate members in good standing.
